While the organization opened last year with sales to individuals, Peterson has expanded her customer-base by selling her eggs to local restaurants and health-food organizations. Peterson produces her own eggs, but seeks suppliers of pasture-raised chickens to supplement her production so Fruit of the Coop may continue to expand.

The new space allows for more than twice the square footage for the establishment, which will feature food service by the end of July. The pub also features a patio, dining area, and small casino in addition to the bar.
